



This signed Iradj Moini 2¾" long giant beetle insect brooch with yellow marble glass cabochons and diamante rhinestones was pictured in Carole Tanenbaum's 2006 book, *Fabulous Fakes: A Passion for Vintage Costume Jewelry*, on page 191, in the chapter titled "The Eighties and Nineties (1980-1999), Garish, Minimal, Severe." It sold for \$812.50 (est. \$600/800).



This Robert Sorrell scalloped amber, orange, and diamante crystal collar necklace sold for \$750 (est. \$600/800).



This signed Margot De Taxco Mexican Modernist sterling silver snake link necklace with green enamel scales, 4" diameter, sold for \$1000 (est. \$800/1200).



This rare signed De Mario Egyptian Revival festooned necklace, with a molded glass pharaoh head in a relief gilt filigree medallion and dangling Czech art glass blue and green beads, sold for \$812.50 (est. \$550/750).



Carole Tanenbaum's collection included a group of Bakelite items. The group of 1930s-40s Bakelite painted animal figural brooches by Martha Sleeper, including Thumper, Bambi, and a flying horse, 3" high, sold for \$550 (est. \$550/750).



Carole Tanenbaum's collection included vintage Scottish items. This Scottish Victorian sterling silver, inlaid multi-agate, flat-link bracelet, the center layered with an open swirl decoration, with a 2¼" cuff width, brought \$812.50 (est. \$550/650).



This 1940s Chanel 16" long necklace designed by Rousselet, with ruby-red poured glass and multi-pearl floral clusters having giant baroque pearl centers and seed pearl accents, realized \$750 (est. \$300/500).



This 1940s signed Hobé white chinoiserie figural Orientalist brooch, 2¼" high x 1½" wide, with a carved Japanese netsuke and multi-crystal filigree halo, brought \$531.25 (est. \$200/300).



This 1940s group of three Trifari brooches, including a key, a Moghul moth/butterfly, and a jeweled hand with a diamante cuff, sold for \$1375 (est. \$600/700).



This diamante crystal collar necklace, with pink glass cabochons and marquises surrounding a drop pendant, is signed for Thorin & Co. and designer Timothy Szlyk. It sold for \$1875 (est. \$500/700).
